During the course of your membership here, you will learn in detail about these subjects. We have Basic Biblical Training Classes, in which these and other principles are taught. We encourage you to get involved in the Basic Biblical Training Classes to start your spiritual growth in the Body of Christ.

History of Heart to Heart International Ministries, Inc.

Heart to Heart International Ministries, Inc. is a non-denominational, full Gospel, non-profit Religious Corporation with facilities located at 106 Behrman Street, Moncks Corner, and South Carolina 29461. It is a South Carolina non-profit corporation. Heart to Heart International Ministries conducts regular religious services, seminars, bible schools, and other church-related activities. Heart to Heart International Ministries also produces and broadcasts a television program of its services.

Heart to Heart International Ministries was conceived by God into Drs. Jerome & Tonia Taylor's hearts during a telephone conversation in 1990. They continued their course of ministry training to develop God's Vision that He placed within their hearts. The Taylor's final ministry training ground was developed at Truth for Living Ministries of Jacksonville, Florida, where Archbishop Leonard & Bishop Carolyn Love are the pastors.

After faithfully serving their pastors for seven years, they felt the timing of God was upon them to return to Moncks Corner, SC to start the ministry that God had birthed into their spirit. Their pastors, Archbishop Leonard and Bishop Carolyn Love, released them and gave them their blessing to go forth and do what God had called them to do. Heart to Heart International Ministries was organized and incorporated in March 1999, to provide religious services and ministry to the general public. On March 14, 1999, with only four members (the Taylor's and their two children), they conducted their first Sunday morning service in a 2,000 square feet storefront facility with an attendance of 30 people. After one year of service to the community, it was evident that the Hand of God was upon their lives for Ministry. Heart to Heart International Ministries began to experience growing pains, and the current facility was too small to accommodate the growth. On March 14, 2000, the church relocated to another storefront facility with 3,500 square feet of space to accommodate God's people.

A second location was established September 2001 at 119 West Main Street, Moncks Corner, SC. The second location served as an After School Care program: a community service to school-aged children ranging from preschool through high school. This program provided homework assistance five days a week and continues today in our present facility.

On April 30, 2004, Heart to Heart International Ministries purchased a 30,000 square feet mall complex located at 106 Behrman Street, in beautiful downtown Moncks Corner, South Carolina. This facility is now the home of our many in-reach and out-reach ministries along with our After School Care Program.

Heart to Heart International Ministries is a member of Progressive Interfaith Ministries Association (P.I.M.A.). P.I.M.A. is an organization based out of Jacksonville, Florida. Archbishop

Leonard Love is the overseer and President of P.I.M.A. P.I.M.A. provides annual conferences, church growth and development strategies, continuing Christian education, and most importantly accountability in leadership performance for pastors toward their local congregation.

The Purpose of the Church

The church is a divine institution, created in the mind of God to set before the world His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. The word for church comes from the Greek “ekklesia” which means the “Called Out Ones.” In the New Testament, it is most generally referred to as the local body, a fellowship of baptized believers who voluntarily banded themselves together for worship, nurture, and service. According to scripture, the church was created by God and brought to life by the Spirit to serve the purposes of Christ on earth. Within the context of the New Testament Scriptures, we can define four purposes of the church:

1. **To Worship:** Worship is encountering God in experiences that deepens a Christian’s faith and strengthens him or her for service. Worship of God in Christ should be at the center of all else the church is and does.
2. **To Proclaim and Witness:** All Christians, the entire church, are to be witnesses of Christ’s saving grace.
3. **To Nurture and Educate:** Nurture is the sum of experiences that nourish and develop individuals in the Body. Education is those processes that provide for growth in knowledge, wisdom, and Christian performance. The church was commanded to teach. The early church took this responsibility to disciple seriously. Believers are responsible for growth and action toward Christian maturity. Church leaders are charged to cause this growth.
4. **To Minister:** The church takes from Christ Himself the example of servant ministry. He instructed His followers to forget themselves and give themselves wholly to the service of others. While ministry takes many forms, as Christians all we do and say is to be accomplished in His name.

The New Testament church was an organization with appointed leaders and officers who created structure and policy to implement the commission of Christ. While they were self-governing, autonomous congregations, they were a theocracy, led by God as the Spirit spoke to its leaders, headed by Christ. Heart to Heart International Ministries has instituted five general ministry areas in expression of our interpretation of God’s direction for this church. They will be:

1. Worship: Sunday morning and Tuesday evening services led by pastor/teacher.
2. Pastoral: Activities of the ministry to the Body and community as directed by the Holy Spirit.
3. Educational: General Church Development, Basic Biblical Training, Children and Youth Development, Mid-Week Bible Study, After School Program, Christian Academy,

Accredited Bible College, and other specialized and general training and learning programs directed by the Leading and Inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

4. Music & Performing Arts: Led by Music/Singing Department, Performing Arts led by the Christian Performing Arts Ministry.
5. The Church Family: Programs of Enrichment and Koinonia (Fellowship & Love).

Heart to Heart International Ministries is a church composed of all those who have trusted and confessed Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior. They are people who have publicly made a decision, by the showing of their hand, during an appeal for church membership. Appeals for church membership are shared during Sunday and Tuesday worship services and special programs.

- Hebrews 10:25 states “Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: And so much the more, as ye see the day approaching.”

It is clear in the Word of God that He wants people to be a part of a local church.

Psalm 92:13 states “Those that be planted in the house of the Lord shall flourish in the courts of our God.”

We see again in scripture that God wants us to be a part of a local church so that our lives can be productive and fruitful. Total commitment and active participation with a local church are mandated for spiritual growth. The purpose of membership, in a local church, is so that we are in a position where we can be taught the Word of God and develop our spiritual maturity, so that we can be established on a secure, solid foundation. Such a foundation assures stability. From it, wholeness is developed – spiritually, physically, emotionally, socially, and financially.

How to Benefit from Church Membership

You can get the most out of your membership by understanding your purpose for being a member. When the membership appeal was made, the commitment to you was to provide the necessary staff to meet your spiritual needs and stand before you anointed to teach the things of God in a manner that you may understand and apply them. We have fellowship opportunities, worship services, Bible studies and various other ministries. By your willingness to participate, you will meet people and develop relationships with other believers in the church. It is very important that you surround yourself with people who have made a decision to give their lives to Christ and have made a commitment to live for Him. We encourage you to take full advantage of everything that your church has to offer.

You benefit most by getting involved.

How to Get Involved

“and God hath set some in the church . . . Thirdly teachers after that miracles, and then gifts of healing, HELPS, governments . . .” I Corinthians 12:28

The Helping Hearts Ministry of HHIM consist of various groups of volunteer workers who assist the pastoral and ministerial staff in meeting the spiritual needs of the members and the people who participate in the worship, Bible Study and social activities of HHIM.

All HELPS Ministry workers must be tithing, fellowshipped members of the church for six months before being eligible to participate in a HELPS Ministry, having received Jesus as Lord and Savior, baptized with the Holy Spirit (with the evidence of speaking in tongues), and baptized in water. In addition, such persons must be men and women of the highest moral standards who have been free, for at least six months, from smoking, drinking, drugs, and/or any illicit sexual activity before being considered for the Helping Hearts Ministry. Such persons must also display good personal hygiene.

Pastoral Commitments

Dr. Jerome A. Taylor is the Senior Pastor of Heart to Heart International Ministries.

The term pastor is used interchangeably in the scriptures with the terms “Elder & Overseer (Acts 20:17, 28). The primary work of the Pastor shall be to devote himself to prayer and the ministry of the Word. The Pastor’s commitment to the membership of HHIM shall be as follows:

1. Give general oversight of the flock (Acts 20:28; Heb 13:17; I Thes 5:12)
 - a. In practical matters (Acts 6:1-6, 11:29-30)
 - b. In matters of doctrine (Acts 15, 16:4)
 - c. In matters of discipline/character (Heb 13:17)
2. Shepherd the flock (I Peter 5:2; Acts 20:28; Heb 13:17; James 5:14)
3. Equip the saints for the work of ministry (Eph 4:11)
4. Teach the flock (I Tim 3:2, 5:17; I Thes 5:12)
5. Exhort in sound doctrine (Titus 1:9)
6. Refute those who contradict sound doctrine (Titus 1:9)
7. Example the standards of godliness (I Tim 3:1; I Peter 5:3)
8. Lead the church in a caring ministry for persons in the church and the community.
9. Conduct spiritual advising; perform weddings; conduct funerals.
10. Lead the church in effective ministry of evangelism; plan & conduct programs of community witness.
11. Work with church leaders, program directors, and church committees in conducting, planning, training, and evaluation of church ministries.
12. Love you unconditionally, care for you earnestly, and pray for you daily.

Membership Commitment

Each member has the responsibility for maintaining a life that is an example of righteousness. Each member must consider the importance of being a faithful participant who will produce growth, development, maturity, and spiritual stability. This is how you, your church, and home will continue to grow.

We pray that you will take the necessary steps to become involved and experience the blessing of increase in every area of your life, as you are willing and obedient to the service of the Lord and to your local church. (Isaiah 1:19)

1. Obey the Word of God and live out a daily righteous commitment as unto the Lord. (JOB 36:11)
2. Love the Lord our God and your fellowman, making an effort to walk in unity with all people. (MATT 22:37-40)
3. Be actively involved in regular church attendance and special services giving of your service to the body utilizing your gifts and talents. (HEB 10:25; ROM 11:29)
4. Joyful and willful participation in financial church support of tithes, offerings, and pastoral love offerings. (II COR 9:7; MAL 3:7-12)
5. Faithful weekly attendance to Basic Biblical Training. (EPH 4:11-15)
6. Know the Vision, Goal, and the Assignment of this ministry. (HAB 2:2-3)
7. Love the pastor and his family unconditionally. Care for them earnestly and pray for them daily. (HEB 13:17-18; MATT 22:37-40)
8. Love your church family (members and visitors) unconditionally. Care for them earnestly and pray for them daily. (JOHN 13:34-35)
9. Members shall schedule appointments to discuss personal matters of concern. Before or after service will not provide the necessary time needed to discuss such matters of importance. (I COR 14:40)
10. If you are hospitalized, it is your responsibility to notify the pastors, the church staff, or have a family member notify us. (JAMES 5:14-15)
11. Be sure you have properly notified your previous Pastor(s) or church staff of your new church membership status with HHIM. To experience fulfillment at HHIM, let's do things decently and in order. (I COR 14:40)
12. Each member will be responsible for carrying out the stated guidelines and teachings set forth in this operations manual. (HEB 13:17-18; I TIM 6:11)

Commitment of HHIM Leaders

Leaders are a blessing from God to any ministry. Therefore, we hold our leaders in high esteem and accountability. Leaders are exemplary and are expected to hold in high regard God's Word, the Visionary, and the Vision God gives to him and God's people.

1. Leaders are required to attend monthly meetings that are vital to the progress of HHIM. Leaders should miss no more than three (3) meetings per year.
2. Should a meeting be missed, it is the sole responsibility of that leader to notify the pastor immediately. Leaders must acquire the information distributed during a previous meeting from another leader.
3. At the end of each year, during the second week of December, unless otherwise stated, HHIM holds its annual leadership training session. This weekend session is mandatory. Any portion of this meeting missed will result in the leader's inability to serve that upcoming year. (Location will be announced)
4. Any friction or conflict that arises among leaders will be brought before the pastor and a decision will be made concerning continuance of service.
5. Should you desire to no longer serve in leadership, a written statement, requesting your release, should be addressed to Bishop Jerome Taylor. This document will become a part of your permanent file.

We will give them a sermon through music and the arts so that we can creatively give them the love and hope of Our Savior Jesus Christ.
12. Commitment to Fellowship: We will always have Programs of Enrichment that produce Koinonia (Fellowship & Love) for the saints of God. We will always fellowship and look out for one another, while building an environment that promotes a sense of family, belonging, worth, value, love, and genuine concern for the saints of God.

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION

Benevolent Care or Blessing Bank

What do you do when you need a little help? HHIM has established a clothing and food bank to help assist our members in their time of need.

Removal from Church Roll

HHIM provides weekly or biweekly telephone calls, letters and, from time to time, will make home visits through our "I Care" follow-up program. If we are unable to make any contact with a member or haven't seen a member in service for at least six months, we reserve the right to remove your name from our church roll.

Hospitalization

If you are admitted to the hospital, it is your responsibility to communicate that to us, either directly or by having a loved one communicate it to the church staff. Please do not just communicate it to a member of the church. Report directly to the membership staff or church office. It is our desire to know and to pray for you, visit with you, and to have your brothers and sisters in the Lord praying for you at that time.

Funerals

Members: As a member, it is your responsibility to convey your desires to your family as to whether your home-going service will be held at our church. It is not our responsibility to fight or contend with your family. If you don't cover these things with them, we will simply go along with the wishes of your family. If they do not want the service held at our church, we will attend wherever it is held, within reason. We will do what we can to meet the needs of your family. If a funeral (Home-Going Service) is to be held at our church, we will assign coordinators to coordinate all of the events and everything will be done decently and in order.

Immediate Family Member: If one of your immediate family members passes away and goes to be with the Lord, it is your responsibility to inform the church. Do not tell another member of the church expecting them to communicate it to us. As you let Membership Ministry Services or our church staff know, we will minister to your spiritual needs. The senior pastor, assistant pastor, or our Ministry Care Team will be with you. It is our purpose to be available to meet whatever spiritual needs you and your family may have at that time.

Unchurched Loved Ones: If your loved one is unchurched, we will make our church available for the services. You must follow the established guidelines for memorial services.

Making An Appointment

To schedule an appointment with the Senior Pastor, Co-pastor, or one of the other Ministers, please call our office Monday – Friday from 1:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. and speak with one of the secretaries.

Personal Ministry

When you have challenges and need personal ministry, the senior pastor, co-pastor, or someone from the church staff is available to minister to our members. Please remember, the pastor is only one person. Therefore, his time is limited. If an appointment can't be scheduled for a time that is mutually agreeable, you will be referred to a capable staff person. There are capable ministers available to meet your needs. Everything discussed in these ministry sessions will be kept in the highest confidence.

Weddings

It is a joy to our heart to see people come together in the institution of marriage and we do perform weddings at our church. We have a Wedding Coordinator. If you or one of your children, who attend the church, desires to have a wedding, an appointment must be made with the Wedding Coordinator.

Everyone getting married will be asked to complete an eight-week premarital enrichment course. This eight-session course will commence with the initial visit to arrange the wedding.

Following the wedding, all florists, caterers or family materials should be removed immediately from the church facility. Some material may be left overnight if prearranged with the building supervisor. Items left and not prearranged with the building supervisor will be removed and HHIM will not be responsible for damaged or missing items.

Reception Following Wedding: If you plan to use the reception area please notify the wedding coordinator immediately. Final use of the kitchen facility must be arranged with the Food Preparation Coordinator. A fee may be requested for the Food Preparation Team and Clean Up Committee.

Church Equipment

Equipment and materials donated or purchased with the direct funds of the church will only be used in support of the ministries and programs of the church. The use of church equipment

and supplies for personal needs will generally not be authorized. Therefore HHIM will not loan church equipment such as tables, chairs, sound equipment, etc. All church items, purchased or donated, are for the sole use of church functions only.

No Conflict Rule

There should be no activity planned by an auxiliary or department that will conflict with overall scheduled events or vision of HHIM. Before public announcement of any kind, the pastors or administration must approve all events. Before any information is distributed it must be edited and approved. This includes all written documents such as in-house information, flyers, notes, etc.

Returned Checks

All checks returned to the HHIM finance office due to insufficient funds will be assessed a \$30.00 returned check fee. If you have written a check that is returned, you will be responsible for the total amount of the check plus the \$30.00 returned check fee. If a check can be sent through a second time, please notify our finance office immediately.
